

Our Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday is known as Good Shepherd Sunday because, in each year of the liturgical cycle on this 4th Sunday, the Gospel is always taken from the 10th chapter of John where Jesus speaks of himself as the "good shepherd".

In today's passage, Jesus emphasises the self-sacrificing element in his own life: "The good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep." He contrasts the good shepherd who owns the sheep to someone who is simply hired to look after them. The hired man thinks primarily of his own welfare and, if he sees a wolf coming, he takes off, leaving the sheep to be attacked and scattered in fear and terror. Jesus, on the other hand, will not be like a hired person: "I lay down my life for my sheep." Perhaps he contrasts himself with those religious leaders among his own people – and to be found in every religious grouping – who do just what is expected of them but have no real commitment or sense of responsibility to those in their charge.

One of the oldest paintings of Christ. in the Roman catacombs, represents Christ as carrying the injured sheep gently on His shoulders back to the sheepfold. This imagery of the Good Shepherd has been an important aspect of the Church pastoral theology for two thousand years and it informs the churches understanding of ministerial priesthood.



Today we remember to pray for priests who minister in the

Church and that God will sustain them in their Vocation and in particular during these days of COVID restrictions.

1st Reading Acts 2:14, 36-41

Also recently Pope Francis asked Catholics to make a special effort in May to pray the Rosary, knowing that by doing so they would be united with believers around the world asking for Mary's intercession to assist in the fight against the coronavirus pandemic. "Contemplating the face of Christ with the heart of Mary, our mother, will make us even more united as a spiritual family and will help us overcome this time of trial," the Pope said in a letter addressed to all Catholics and released by the Vatican on the 25th of April.

The month of May is traditionally devoted to Mary and many Catholics already are in the habit of praying the rosary at home during the month, he noted. "The restrictions of the pandemic have made us come to appreciate all the more this 'family' aspect, also from a spiritual point of view."

Pope Francis wrote two prayers to Mary that can be recited at the end of the rosary, prayers he said he would be reciting "in spiritual union with all of you."
