Pastor's Message

Through eyes of faith, the passing of the years looks somewhat Monday 6th March different. We believe our journey is going somewhere: instead of simply terminating with death, we will emerge into the life of heaven. We are pilgrims, like Abraham, moving toward the land of promise. Like St Paul, we try to deal with the problems and setbacks along the way, with the help of the Lord. And in the end, if we are faithful, we will share the total joy of joining Christ in glory, as the reward of life's pilgrimage.

Pilgrim's Progress: In our many journeys today (the age of mobility) we tend to move around a lot, without showing much signs of spiritual progress; indeed, in that respect we often appear to be going backwards. Our goals and desires can be short-term, narrow, superficial. Moved by a restless urge for money, for celebrity, novelty, success and pleasure, we go round in rapid circles. But the pilgrims' sights are set on a higher destination, and like Martin Luther King they can say: "I have a dream!" However far-off and hard to reach this dream may be, it is worth more than all the short-term desires we follow. Each step on the journey takes on meaning in light of the goal God sets before us.

A personal, inward journey: Our whole life can be made a pilgrimage towards God. Just as he called Abraham, so he calls each of us to be his own. His call to us is guiet but insistent. Not exactly in the form of: "leave your country and your father's house," but "leave your old ways, the pride and selfishness, the hardness of heart, the angry temper, the envy and the falsehood. And go to the land I shall show." The direction of our pilgrimage is not geographical but moral: "Go towards charity, purity, sharing in truth and prayer and good-will. Go in the way of the gospel. Go to heaven.

Meaningful Living: Having God's command, and submitting entirely to it, made Abraham the first great pilgrim. Henceforth all his activity took on the value of obedience to God; he was on the high road towards Yahweh, the living God. The same spirit would give the deepest meaning to our lives too. Far from being absurd or useless, the pilgrim's efforts to follow the gospel of Jesus are full of meaning. Progress along this way is the real formula for peace of mind. St Augustine said it profoundly: 'You have made us for Yourself, O Lord; and our hearts can never be at rest, until they rest in You'. God Bless, Fr Mark

Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community.

Liturgical Ministers

What is a Reader of the Word?

A Reader of the Word is the parishioner selected by the Pastor who proclaims the first or second reading at Mass. This person also leads the Psalm (while the cantor or choir leads the response) and the introduction and Prayers of the Faithful at Mass

What is a Eucharistic Minister?

A Eucharistic / Communion Minister is a parishioner, selected by the Pastor and mandated by the Bishop, who serves, distributes, and administers the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ during the Holy Communion or Eucharist of the Church Service and take communion to the sick when required

What is a Mass Coordinator?

A Mass Coordinator coordinates the liturgical minister roles, making sure the worship space is ready for the celebration of the Holy Eucharist.

Stations of the Cross

For centuries, Roman Catholic believers have celebrated the Stations of the Cross, or Way of the Cross, usually the week before Easter. The Stations of the Cross refer both to a series of depictions of Christ's journey from the court of Pontius Pilate to the tomb and to a short pilgrimage centred around these stations.

"The object of the Stations is to help the faithful to make in spirit, as it were, a pilgrimage to the chief scenes of Christ's sufferings and death."

The practice of visiting each station to pray originated with early Christian pilgrims who visited the historic sites of the events and walked the route believed to be from Pilate's house to Christ's tomb.

During Lent the Parish will walk the way of the Cross on Wednesday's, concluding 29th March – 7:00pm at Our Lady of the Rosary Church Kenmore.
